HOW to obtain a Portable Common Loops (PCL)

- 1) read the contents of the "assurance agreement" which is attached.
- 2) If you and your company agree, write your own agreement sheet WITH the sign of the authorized person.
'the authrized person' does not always mean the president.
BUCHO or SHOCHO is enough in the past experience.
Only one agreement is needed by one company.
(different sections from yours can use PCL after your license is accepted. it means , from ida's opinion, that XEROX PARC consider an agreement sheet you will make is representing your company as a total effect).
Must use a letter paper with the COMPANY LETTER HEAD.
- 3) send an original and a copy to
Gregor Kiczales at Xerox PARC 3333 Coyote Hill Road, Palo Alto, CA,94304
- 4) wait for a while.
- 5) Gregor send me (ida@utokyo-relay.csnet) an E-mail telling the agreement is acknowledged by xerox.
- 6) ida send an E-mail to you.
- 7) send ida a copy of assurance agreement you sent.

PCL is copyright protected, but the copyright says very clearly that people are allowed to copy, use, sell, redistribute and do whatever else they want with PCL. The only thing they are not allowed to do is send it to the countries in the letter of assurance agreement. But they can put it in their product and sell it if they want. Please clarify your procedure to make it more clear what you mean by copyright protected.

ALL the steps I described above is the result of xerox PARC people including the XEROX lawyer.

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LETTER OF ASSURANCE AGREEMENT

"This Agreement is subject to United States Export Control Regulations. Notwithstanding any other provision hereof, YOUR COMPANY NAME will not export, directly or indirectly, any U.S. source technical data acquired from Xerox, or any products utilizing any such data, to Romania, Libya, Poland, Albania, Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, German Democratic Republic (including East Berlin), Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Mongolian People's Republic, Afghanistan, People's Republic of China, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, Cuba, North Korea, Vietnam, Kampuchea (Cambodia), Laos or to any other country from which the U.S. Government or any agency thereof at the time of export requires an export license or other governmental approval, without first obtaining the written consent to do so from the Department of Commerce or other agency of the U.S. Government whenever required by an applicable statute or regulation."
